Driving directions to Pat Shores home:

Take 44 to the Eureka exit #264 to 109. Turn south on 109 and drive about a mile to The Legends subdivision brick sign. The sign is on the right side of 109 roughly across the street from the entrance to the new shopping center on the left side of 109 and between the Jefferson Bank and the City of Eureka buildings. Go straight into The Legends subdivision on Legends Parkway. Continue to the back of the subdivision about 2 miles. Pass the Legends Country Club property. Go three quarters around the traffic circle and turn right on Southern Hills Drive. Pass the second swimming pool and turn right at the 3 way stop on to Stone Spring Drive.
