#### **Immigrants and Refugees from a Global Perspective**

Uma A. Segal is professor and baccalaureate program director in the School of Social Work at the University of Missouri, St. Louis. Dr. Segal served 2007-2015 as resident scholar on migration on the Advisory Board of the Katherine A. Kendall Institute (KAKI), an international arm of the Council

on Social Work Education (CSWE). She was editor in chief of the *Journal of Immigrant & Refugee Studies* from 2004-2012, and is coeditor of the book *Immigration Worldwide: Policies, Practices, and Trends.* Dr. Segal has participated in research projects on cross-national comparisons of migration in Athens, Greece, Sofia, Bulgaria, and Tokyo, Japan, and has been an invited speaker in several Asian and European countries. In addition, her research has taken her to Brazil, India, Russia, and the United Kingdom.

#### The Trans Pacific Partnership: Status Update

Dave Robertson, PhD, Professor and chair of the Political Science Department, University of Missouri St. Louis and University of Missouri Curators Teaching Professor. Dr. Robertson's

would eventually rise to International Vice-President of ACTWU (now Workers United). After retiring in 2001 she became a leader in Missouri Jobs with Justice.
