# Message from President, Chris Nobbe

# The #MeToo Campaign

Harvey Weinstein is not the only person charged with sexual harassment, and many women and men have been sexually abused as children or

as adults. According to <u>Darkness to Light</u>, about one in 10 children will be sexually abused before their 18th birthday. According to the <u>National Sexual Violence</u> <u>Resource Center</u> one in four girls and one in six boys will be sexually abused before they turn 18 years old. (These statistics are supported by studies with different conclusions.) Sexual assault, rape, and sexual harassment continue to be problems for women (and men) in adulthood. According to <u>RAINN</u> every 98 seconds an American is sexually assaulted and on average there are 321,500 victims (age 12 or older) of rape and sexual assault each year in the United States.

Understanding the enormity of the problem of sexual harassment has been researched by AAUW and reported in *Crossing the Line: Sexual Harassment at School.* The report can be downloaded at <u>https://www.aauw.org/research/crossing-the-line/</u>. A far less formal study, the #MeToo campaign on Twitter and Facebook, seeks to demonstrate just how prevalent the problem is and its impact on females. My Twitter feed and Facebook timeline were full of #MeToo stories or just a simple "me too." *The Atlantic* reported on the campaign and <u>their article</u> ended with this: "There's a monumental amount of work to be done in confronting a climate of serial sexual predation—one in which women are belittled and undermined and abused and sometimes pushed out of their industries altogether. But uncovering the colossal scale of the problem is revolutionary in its own right."

### Stand with AAUW to Keep Title IX Strong

In the 45 years since Congress passed Title IX legislation prohibiting sex-based discrimination in federally funded education programs, schools have made huge strides in providing equal access to education by simply creating the same opportunities to learn for all students.

Secretary of Education Betsy DeVos has taken the first step in dismantling protections for survivors of campus sexual assault, claiming that existing guidelines have "failed". According to this logic, the Secretary sees that schools which fail to adequately protect students provide a reason to weaken Title IX protections, rather than enforce them. Her decision to open up Title IX for changes is a blatant intent to roll back protections for students. It is an action that is in direct odds with upholding the civil rights of all Americans.

AAUW stands with survivors and remains committed to defending Title IX. AAUW urges schools to leave in place their current strong policies. We must ensure our nation's dedication to full and equal educational opportunities for all students. With progress under attack, now more than ever we need to make our voices heard.
