Message from President Chris Nobbe

To become better informed about the AAUW 2018 Strategic Plan, I am doing research on the strategic focus areas (image to

the right). I decided to start with "ensuring livelihoods for women" and quickly came upon the Global Gender Gap Report by the World Economic Forum at

http://www3.weforum.org/docs/WEF_GGGR_2017.pdf. This extensive report includes data from 140 countries. The chart below shows educational levels attained by males and females in the USA and the degree fields. As you can see, males and females are neck and neck in education, except at the PhD level. Women are under-represented in many degree areas, including engineering, manufacturing, construction, IT, and to a lesser degree natural sciences, mathematics, and statistics. I need to dig further to see if I can see the comparison of math to the natural sciences. I invite you to take a few minutes to dig into the report and see what you can discover.

AAUW Empowering Working Women in Kansas and Missouri

The American Association of University Women

(AAUW), the Women's Foundation, and Kansas City's Mayor Sly James launched the first phase of an initiative to empower 1 million women to successfully negotiate salary and benefits and close the gender pay gap in both Kansas and Missouri. The initiative will begin in Kansas City, where the overall gender pay ratio for the Kansas City metro area is 78 percent (a 22 percent gap). Three Work Smart sessions are scheduled for September and October.

AAUW Work Smart helps women who are already in the workforce at any career level negotiate for a new job, raise, or promotion. Go to

Pecans are one of the easiest ways to give your recipes an added boost in flavor and nutrients. From a handful of roasted pecans added to your morning yogurt to an extra crunchy topping in your salad, it's worth keeping your freezer stocked with pecans to make easy, healthy additions to your recipes. Certified by the American Heart Association, pecans are the most antioxidant-rich tree nut and are among the top 15 foods to contain the highest antioxidant capacity. Antioxidants are powerful nutrients that slow the aging process and reduce the risk of cancer, heart disease, diabetes, and Alzheimer's. Remember: Pecans can be kept fresh in the freezer for up to two years so go ahead and get a whole case!

You are invited to the *Midwest Human Trafficking Conference*, on *Friday, September 28, 2018*, from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm at Spellman Center, Anheuser-Busch Leadership Room, Lindenwood University.

About the Conference:

The conference will bring together multidisciplinary professionals from law enforcement, the legal profession, child protective services, victim advocacy agencies, traumatic stress organizations, medical and mental health/treatment providers, youth-serving organizations, school administration, educators and school counselors, faith groups, and the public to;

- Ø Gain basic understanding and knowledge of human trafficking, and the prevalence and pervasiveness of human trafficking in the St Louis Metropolitan area,
- Ø Identify vulnerabilities that traffickers exploit to recruit and traffic persons, and the role and impact technology has on this process, including manipulative strategies,
- Ø Recognize the neurobiological impact of trauma within relational development and growth, the ability to function in different social environments, and learn strategies and tools to successfully serve victims of trafficking,

More specifically, it will look at potential solutions based on trauma-informed and victim-centered approaches for working with youth victims of human trafficking across multiple environments. Also, the conference will provide POST certification for law enforcement and CLE certification for attorneys.

Conference Presenters:

- Opening remarks will be delivered by: Mr. Timothy Lohmar, St. Charles Prosecuting Attorney, and Howard J. Marcus, Supervisory Assistant U.S. Attorney with the National Security/Child Exploitation Section.
- Individual sessions will be informed by a series of keynote speakers, including: TC Cassidy, Director of Organizational Advancement, National Safe Place Network, and Debi Grebenik, Chief Learning Officer of Alia.

Vision for the Conference:

An important aim of this conference is to **offer networking opportunities from all over the Midwest region**. Through your participation, you can help our communities better understand that human trafficking is an ethics and human rights issue, a problem that ruins the lives of everyone it touches, an issue demanding to be recognized as a public health concern, and a matter that needs to be addressed in an active social and educational platform.

STORING PECANS under refrigeration is the best way to retain the fresh aroma, color, and flavor of pecans. The lower the temperature, the longer the pecans will keep, although there is no critical temperature below which pecans must be held. Pecans stored in a **refrigerator** (38 to 40 degrees F) will keep for more than nine months. In the **freezer** at 0 degrees F they will remain in good condition for two years or longer. Unused pecans **may be refrozen** again and again without adverse effect on the quality or texture of the pecans.



The pecans should be delivered before the holiday baking season, depending on the growing season and weather. Please make checks payable to "AAUW K-WG Branch."
