WILL THE 2024 LEGISLATIVE YEAR BE A REPEAT OF 2023?

The Missouri legislative session in 2023 reflected the culture wars, beginning with the passage of a dress code for women legislators. The General Assembly ses-

sion saw the introduction of more than 3,000 non-budget bills with only 43 passing. Changes to the initiative petition process, a corporate tax cut, state control of the St. Louis police department, education bills targeting critical race theory and others fizzled out despite being priorities for the GOP supermajority. These issues no doubt will be back in 2024.

Our speaker at our September 21 meeting 90th District Representative Barbara Phifer will give her perspective on the 2023 legislative year and upcoming agenda for 2024.

Barbara was first elected in 2020 running on a platform of building strong communities, health care for all, quality education for all children. and productive jobs that pay a living wage.

Before retirement in 2019 Barbara served as a United Methodist pastor for 41 years in Missouri except for five years in Montevideo, Uruguay.

Following Barbara's informative presentation, there will be time for sharing strategies, ideas, and upcoming branch activities. Refreshments will be served.
